# The Beach



## DOUBLE RED FLAG

A double red flag means the water is closed to the public due to hazardous water conditions.



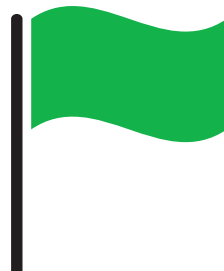
## RED FLAG

A red flag means that the water is closed to swimmers due to dangerous conditions such as strong currents, high surf, or hazardous marine life.



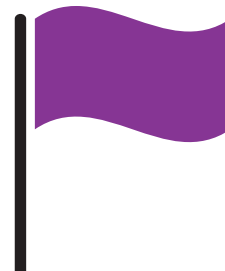
## YELLOW FLAG

A yellow flag indicates that swimmers should use caution when entering the water. There may be moderate surf or currents that could make swimming difficult.



## GREEN FLAG

A green flag means that the water is safe for swimming, but swimmers should still exercise caution and be aware of their surroundings.



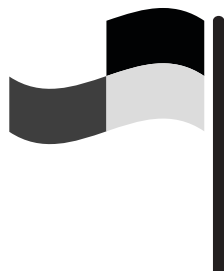
## PURPLE FLAG

A purple flag indicates the presence of dangerous marine life such as jellyfish, sharks, or stingrays. Swimmers should be cautious and avoid these creatures if possible.



## RED AND YELLOW FLAG

Recommended swimming area with lifeguard supervision.



## CHECKERED FLAG

A checkered flag is used to designate an area for surfers and other watercraft. Swimmers should stay out of this area to avoid collisions.
